**New year, new term! Never an easy one to get to grips with, & this letter comes with very best wishes for the weeks ahead. Keep warm!**

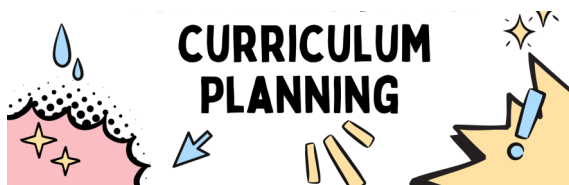
